

# Poverty proofing the school day – new resource for schools

Child Poverty Action Group and Children North East have recently published a <u>Cost of the School Day calendar</u> resource for schools and school staff. The aim of the calendar is to help schools identify possible cost barriers during the academic year and think about some alternatives to make sure all children and young people can fully participate in education. # No to the Coup - Cut Links with Sudan's Military

MENA Solidarity condemns the coup launched by General Abdelfatah al-Burhan on 25 October which seeks to return Sudan to authoritarian rule and calls for the immediate release of all those detained by the military. Stand in solidarity with Sudan's trade unions and professional associations which have been at the forefront of the struggle for democracy by signing the MENA Solidarity Network open letter against the coup in Sudan.

# Support the Process of Justice in Guatemala

On 11 October, Mrs. Consuelo Porras, Guatemalan Attorney General and Head of the Public Ministry, transferred the prosecutor leading the Human Rights Office of the Public Ministry, from her crucial role in the case of the massacre of over 300 men, women and children at the village of Dos Erres, and the case of 183 civilians who 'disappeared'. Sign the petition to demand that the Attorney General cease her actions against the Human Rights Prosecutor's Office and to demand her resignation.

#### Hands Off West Gate!



On 7<sup>th</sup> December at 4pm, we received the brilliant news that the academy order for West Gate School has been revoked. This is a real win for the school and its community, and a testament to the hard work of all the staff. It's also been a brilliant collaborative campaign with other unions, and I'd like to thank officers from GMB, the NASUWT and Unison for their commitment as well.

Following an Ofsted inspection in 2018, West Gate School was given an academy order. Since then, the proposed sponsor has withdrawn, and an Ofsted inspection before the summer holidays graded the school as good. This means that the staff, leadership team, governing body and local authority have turned the school around in 3 years, in the middle of a global pandemic. It's an insult to the hard work of all those people that the DfE pressed ahead with a forced academisation and proposed a new sponsor based in Yorkshire with a single failing secondary school. It is unclear how academising the school would benefit it or its pupils.

The Chair of Governors of West Gate, the NEU, and sister unions all wrote to the Regional Schools' Commissioner or new Secretary of State for Education to request the revocation of the academy order.

On 25<sup>th</sup> November, joint unions, parents and school staff lobbied city councillors to support the revocation of the academy order for West Gate school.



# Talking about menopause at work

It's important to challenge the stigma about menopause and have conversations in the workplace about symptoms and adjustments.

The NEU has created resources to support women experiencing menopause and perimenopause to maintain work and cope with the symptoms they experience. The local authority had produced guidance for schools who buy into its HR services (most maintained schools, but not all).

Staff need to be able to raise issues about their symptoms and ask for support and adjustments at work. We should feel comfortable talking about our menopause and how it might affect us.

There are 34 recognised symptoms of menopause and perimenopause that you may not be aware of such as dry or burning mouth, fatigue and joint pain. The symptoms of the menopause can cause women staff to lose confidence in their skill and abilities and sometimes lead to stress, anxiety and depression. These feelings can

lead women to leave the profession unnecessarily. The British Menopause Society has <u>a series of videos</u> can be useful for understanding what is happening and why.

Women over the age of 50 are more likely to be scrutinised under the employer's capability procedures than anyone else in the workforce. <u>NEU guidance, FAQs and Advice</u> on working through the menopause is available.

Talk to your NEU workplace rep, other women in your workplace and your employer about how NEU resources can take the stigma out of the conversations about menopause. Use the NEU checklists to get you started on making the workplace a better, safer place for menopausal and perimenopausal women. Changes to the workplace will make working life more sustainable for menopausal women and will benefit all staff.

# NEU and Save the Children Afghanistan Appeal

I'm sure that, like ourselves, you have been distressed by the news coming out of Afghanistan. Even before the recent political upheaval, Afghanistan was one of the world's toughest places to be a child or a teacher.

Right now, the situation is desperate. With overseas aid frozen, ten million children now require humanitarian assistance. Health care is on the brink of collapse. Secondary schools remain closed to girls. Women educators are unable to return to their jobs, disrupting education for boys as well as girls, and leaving families destitute. Over 3.5 million people are internally displaced and over two million have been displaced to neighbouring countries.

The director of the World Food Programme has said "the next six months will be hell on Earth" – 23 million people are facing starvation.

This is why the National Education Union (NEU) has partnered with Save the Children on an urgent fundraising appeal to help children and families in Afghanistan and those displaced to neighbouring countries to stay safe, healthy and learning.
